All Eyes on Multi-class and Action-packed Windsurfing

Young sailor Chuah Jun Ler hails from Singapore

The SIM 32nd Singapore Open Asian Windsurfing Championship, Inaugural RS: One Asian Championship and 2nd Asian Formula Windsurfing Asian Championship, attracted 134 competitors from 13 countries. They were Hong Kong, Japan, Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, Malaysia, Myanmar, Argentina, Denmark, Great Britain, Australia, Singapore and India, 2013 SEA Games host country. Myanmar and India were first-time participants at the event.

Held from the 16 to 20 January at the NSRCC Sea Sports Centre, this key event on the Singapore windsurfing calendar saw the participants race in various classes, namely Formula, RS:One, RS:X, Techno 293 and SIM Windsurfing championship categories.

Racing got off to a good start with good wind conditions on the first and second days, with wind strength averaging between 7 to 18 knots. Despite a promising wind forecast on Day 3, the unexpected northeast monsoon rain forced the Race Committee to call off racing for the day. The rain persisted on Day 4 and no races were held on the final day.

Four races were run in the Formula fleet where Thailand's Sakda Sakulfaeng (THA 7) beat fellow countryman and 2007 SEA Games Gold Medalist Phanuthat Ruamsap, as well as Singapore's Harold Ma to take the title of the 2013 Men's Asian Champion in the Formula class.

In the RS:One class, a total of seven races were run. The title of the 2013 RS:One Asian Men's Champion went to newly crowned RS:One World Champion Coveta Geylord while Madrigal Harold took the top honours in the Espoir division. Two-time Asian Games medallist, Oka Sulaksana from Indonesia topped the Master division.

Hong Kong's Lee Chun Ting claimed top spot in the RS:X Youth class where the top four positions were all dominated by Hong Kong. Team Singapore's Chuah Jun Ler who scored two third-placed wins, was Singapore's best performer finishing fifth overall.

In the Techno 293 class, the team from Hong Kong continued their dominance with Ma Kwan Ching and Kikabhoy Rafeek claiming the top spots on the leader board for the Youth Girls

and Youth Boys, respectively. Singaporean Ruth Mow put up a credible performance to finish second overall in the Youth Girls category.

The event also saw students from Singapore's tertiary institutions, Saint Joseph Institution, Saint Anthony's Canossian Secondary and Nanyang Girls' racing in the Windsurfing Championship. The team from SIM was a clear winner, with a first-place finish in both the 4m Novice Men and 4m Novice Women categories.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) Vice-President Ng Ser Miang, Guest of Honour presented prestigious awards to winners at the closing ceremony.

Proudly supported by the Singapore Sailing Federation, National Parks, MINK and NSRCC Sea Sports Centre, the 4-day multi-class event provided tons of quality racing for the participants and plenty of on-shore entertainment for both spectators and supporters.

The "Mental Game of Golf"

ou can improve your golf scoring on the course if you follow the technique that I have listed below. The fun part of this exercise is that you do not have to change your current swing. You have just hit your tee shot down the fairway and are now preparing to hit your second shot.

Do you think about your next shot?

- 1. Check the lie of your ball. A ball sitting in a divot or uneven ground will have to be struck differently or played with a more lofted club.
- 2. Check the wind conditions to the flagstick.
- 3. Is the pin placement front, back or to the centre of the green?
- 4. In preparing to play the shot, is the trouble more to the front of the green (bunkers) or more trouble if you were to go over the green?
- 5. Do you visualise the outcome of the shot and pre-play a positive outcome? Jack Nicklaus calls this positive visualisation. 'Going to the movies' before he selected his club and took his stance. Think of the swing this way the club needs mental direction. Positive mental direction is always better than negative.
- 6. Do you have a pre-shot routine whereby after you have pulled the club from your bag, you do the same routine each time? If you do not have a specific routine then you need to establish one.

The pre-shot routine actually puts the golfer on automatic pilot and is a safety value under pressure. If you watch the tour players on both the men and ladies golf tours you will notice that they perform the same routine each time. This would be done on the green as well as the fairway and tee box.

I am sure if you follow the steps outlined, your scores can be improved by establishing a Pre-shot Routine.

Check-list for Success:

- 1. Check the ball lie
- 2. Green Evaluation
- 3. Wind Conditions
- 4. Pin Placement
- 5. Picture your shot "Positive Visualisation"
- 6. Select appropriate club
- 7. Pre-shot routine and swing with confidence

Golf 10 1 Lifting the Ball for Identification

The responsibility for playing the proper ball rests with the player. Each player should put an identification mark on his ball before every game.

The identification mark is decided by the player and the player must be able to identify their own mark



Decision 27/10: The Player is unable to distinguish his ball from another ball

Scenario:

Player A finds two identical balls in the area, but could not determine which ball was his as both balls were identical and neither had any form of identification mark.



Player A tees off without any identification marks on golf ball.


* If the player is unable to identify his ball, then his ball is considered lost.



Player A finds two identical balls and is unable to determine which belongs to him as neither had identification marks.

Tip: Always put an identification mark on your golf ball before tee off.

What's happening on the course - Weeds Control for our Golf Courses

A weed is any plant growing where it is not wanted.

When it occurs as part of a turf grass community, it is often seen as an undesirable plant because of its disruptive effect on the aesthetic appearance, stabilising capacity, or overall utility of a turf.

Large infestations of weed frequently occur where severe soil compaction limits turf grass growth. Weed infested areas are largely not playable due to sogginess, especially during wet weather conditions.

We will be carrying out herbicide spraying to our fairways, roughs, tees and tee surrounds at least 3 to 4 times a year during course maintenance days. For large infested areas, re-turfing works will be carried out and take 2 to 3 weeks for turf recovery. This is to allow golfers to experience a smoother surface

Till next time, keep swinging.
