

Learning from Joe Thiel ..

I was lucky to have the honor of learning from Joe Thiel during his trip to Singapore. Joe Thiel is the Master Trainer of Mizuno and he has been coaching for over 40 years. He was honored with the 'PGA Teacher of the Year' title for three times.

Two Most Important Things in Golf: Impact Position & Our Mind

Joe shared about two of the most important things in golf: impact position and our mind. He introduced us to HeartMath and FocusBand. HeartMath is a technology that helps us to work on our stress levels and connecting our heart to the mind. HeartMath guides players in understanding their mind and teaching them the ability to condition the mind to their benefit. It has proven that a calm mind produces good results in a golf game.

I was privileged to be part of a class that was conducted by Joe with a good elite player, Desmond Kim. It was interesting to see how Joe analyzed Desmond's swing and worked on his pre-shot routine. The focus was on consistency and preciseness. It was a fruitful two-day session watching how Joe worked with Desmond. It has definitely inspired me as a coach, towards building a junior golfer into a champion.

During his visit, Joe also conducted a clinic for junior golfers and a one-to-one session with two potential junior golfers. After spending three days with Joe, I felt refreshed listening to his experience on coaching and watching him impart his vast knowledge on golf. It fueled my love for coaching even more than before and reminded me of the reason why I wanted to be a coach in the first place.

GOLF 1 0 1

Golf 1-0-1 contributor Brian Tan is a member of the Greens Committee, and oversees Rules and Tournaments at NSRCC. When he's not busy officiating as a Rules Official, he can be found losing balls in NSRCC's water hazards.

Anthill and Ants

Ants and their anthill homes are a common occurrence on the golf course, especially in wooded areas. Should a golfer's ball come to rest near a colony, what options would a golfer have? For further clarity, one would need to dig further into the Decisions on the Rules of Golf.

Anthills

According to Decision 23/5, anthills are deemed as loose impediments as they are a cast or heap made by an insect. A player is entitled to remove an anthill under Rule 23-1.

Ants

If a live insect is stationary or crawling on a player's ball, it is not considered to be adhering, and is therefore a loose impediment. What options a golfer have, depends on where the ball lies:

Through The Green: The player may remove the insect with fingers or blow the insect off the ball, taking care not to move the ball, which if moved, would incur a penalty under Rule 18-2.

Putting Green: The player may take the same actions as above, but if the ball moves, there is no penalty under Rule 23-1.

Hazard: The insect is considered to be in the hazard and cannot be touched or physically removed. However, as the insect is live, the player can take action to encourage the insect to move, provided he/she does not touch the insect, ball, or ground or water in the hazard, like waving a hand or towel nearby.

Fire Ants

Under Decision 1-4/10, players are entitled to relief from Dangerous Situations like Rattlesnakes or Bees. Poison Ivy, Cacti or thorny plants are not considered Dangerous Situations but unpleasant lies and no relief is afforded and players must accept.

Under Decision 33-8/22, the R&A clarifies that the bite of a fire ant can cause serious illness. As such, if the player is in danger of being bitten by the fire ants, the player is in equity and entitled to relief under Decision 1-4/10.

Enhancing Security on Online Golf Booking System

Among all local golf clubs, bookings for popular golf slots during peak periods can be a challenging task. It is with this in mind that the Club has been constantly tracking the booking trend and enhance our booking systems to better meet members' needs.

In recent years, with the advancement of internet and smart phone, the trending is heading toward favouring internet booking. The cyber space is now more sophisticated and dangerous. To continue serving members with their booking needs, the Club has taken various measures to enhance the security and performance of our booking system^{t1}.

Website security has been heightened to minimise the risk of having our booking system hacked into. Firewall activity and server logs also closely tracked, to help identify any abnormal activities. We are also looking to thwart software robots or automated programs from accessing the golf booking system.

With the additional security measures^{t2}, the Club also recommends measures such as ensuring the device used to book has a secure network^{t3}, updating your existing browsers periodically and refreshing the internet booking page at an appropriate time. We would like to reinforce that our service vendors have also performed various assessments to ensure that the use of 3rd party hacking tools will not be possible to use on our online booking system.

NSRCC would like to reassure, that our priority is for members to have an enjoyable game of golf at both locations. We will continue to necessitate vigilant efforts are put forth into online booking to be made fuss-free and available to all our members.

Notes:

t1: Internet bandwidth has been increased by 50%, as well as the server capacity has been increased by 4 fold to support the heavy traffic for daily booking of golf games. This enhancement also increases the internal speed up to 10 times faster.




Buggy Path & Park at NSRCC Kranji


Control Your Sweet Tooth

Keep the Fatty Foods in Check

- Plyometric and calisthenics workout helps to ensure that calories are continually expended even at rest.










